The Christ Church Bookstore recently stocked up on some great books!


I wanted to take a page to tell you a bit about some of them in case they pique your interest. They've all been important to me at one stage of my life or another. Here are just a few of the many good ones:



Gilead by Marilynne Robinson

This is a deeply beautiful and moving novel written in the form of letters from an ailing father to his son. The father, the Rev. John Ames had his only son late in life and knows that he won't live much longer, and so he wants to leave something for his boy.


These are touching reflections set in the small fictional town of Gilead, Iowa in the 1950s. If you only read one novel this year, make sure this is it!



Darkness is my Only Companion by Katherine Greene-McCreight

Greene-McCreight is an Episcopal priest and chaplain at Yale. She is a wife, mother, and accomplished scholar. In her 30s, however, she started to struggle with what became a life-long mental illness. This book tells her story, and then grapples with the theological

implications of what it means to be a Christian who struggles with mental health. It's a bit of challenging read but well worth it!



Phantastes by George MacDonald


If you love C. S. Lewis, you'll love George MacDonald, whom Lewis called his "master." This fairy romance is the book that Lewis credited with baptizing his imagination and was pivotal in pointing his life toward Jesus. It's a Victorian tale with that is full of

secret doors and talking trees and all kinds of other good stuff that might make you think of The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe or The Lord of the Rings.

A Burning in my Bones by Winn Collier

Ever heard of Eugene Peterson? He's most famous as the translator of the The Message, a paraphrase of the Bible in contemporary English. But he was also first and a foremost a pastor. Collier gives us the authorized biography of Peterson, beginning

with his childhood in rural Montana, his studies on the East Coast, his long fruitful ministry at church in Bel Air, Maryland, as well as his years teaching at Regent College. This book is a delight to read. Eugene Peterson's sense of what it means to be pastor was pivotal for me in my own discerning a call to ministry.

There are many more gems I could share (and perhaps will!) but for now, I hope this serves to whet your appetite for four great books that might make their way onto your summer reading list!




What is Holy Scripture? And how ought Christians to read it?

Please bring along your favorite non-alcoholic or alcoholic beverages to share.






A New Year begins 9.2.2024
