On the sweltering Wednesday evenings of the summer, when the sun is low on the horizon, a group of men huddle in the air-conditioned Christian education room at Christ Church South. We chat and joke and catch up, then we pray, and we take time to read together, usually from the Bible, and sometimes from other Christian books. After an hour we sing an ancient hymn, Phos Hilaron, then we shuffle off to the patio where we continue the conversation over cold beer and sodas, talking as the setting sun shoots its golden rays through billows of pipe smoke.

This year we are reading a short book by an old saint. The book is called *De Doctrina Christiana* which is usually translated "On Christian Teaching" or "On Christian Doctrine" and it's written by the great African Bishop of Hippo, St. Augustine. He wrote the book to help Christians like us better understand how to read the Bible. And even after more than 1500 years, there is so much for us to learn.


Our discussion ranges each week, and sometimes I wonder, "What was I thinking when I chose this book?!", but more often I feel like we've learned, as a group, some wisdom for the life of faith.

One of the lessons that has stood out me rereading *On Christian Teaching* is Augustine's encouragement to read Scripture with a humble heart. For him, this means when we encounter difficulties in passages of Scripture, or if we come across a verse that doesn't make sense to us, instead of shrugging it off or throwing up our hands and saying, "Whatever!", we ought to lean in close to see what God might be teaching us.

The "obscure phrases" in the Bible, Augustine says, are "all divinely determined, so that pride may be subdued by hard work and intellects which tend to despise things that are easily discovered may be rescued from boredom and reinvigorated" (2.11). In other words, the Holy Spirit places these confusing phrases in the Bible to draw us in, to keep us interested.

He goes on to say, "It is a wonderful and beneficial thing that the Holy Spirit organized the holy scripture so as to satisfy hunger by means of its plainer passages and remove boredom by means of its obscurer ones" (2.15). Everything we need to know can be found in the plainer passages, but there are mysterious passages that are meant to delight and draw us toward God. We can only explore these challenging passages if we approach them humbly, trusting that God has communicated what God wants to communicate.

I want to learn to read Scripture this way. And, more generally, I want to learn to read other texts with the same willingness to dig deeper to learn all that I can, instead of being dismissive or glibly passing over what is a challenge to me. I am thankful for this reminder by St. Augustine.






