

This is a gift of grace. And one of the challenges and joys of the Christian life is finding how we best serve Christ in his Church since "we all have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us" (Romans 12:6). God has provided you and me with certain gifts that we are meant to share.

As we begin a new ministry year at Christ Church and look forward to our Ministry Festival *Serve Beyond Sunday* on September 8th, please prayerfully consider how you might exercise the gifts God's given you for the good of the Church.

You might be a veteran Christian who knows exactly how God has wired you and find joy in serving in this capacity. Or, you might be a new Christian, or a newly practicing Christian, who is still looking for a way to be a blessing and be blessed in our local community.

Wherever you find yourself, this season is an opportunity to explore what God might be calling you to. It's true it doesn't always work out. Sometimes you dread participating in a ministry, which is probably a sign that it's not a good fit for you.

But there are other ministries of which you might think "Nah, that's not for me" that might bring surprising and refreshing joy.

Pray about it. And then give one or two a try. In his time, God will lead you to the role in which you feel most alive and in which you best bring Christ's light to others.

SUNDAY MORNING PRIMER

During staff meeting today we were talking about the importance of consistency in branding and marketing. But when your constituency is made up of older, cradle Episcopalians who've "always called it that", people new to the church who are still trying to figure out when to genuflect and when to cross themselves, and everyone in between it's proven difficult to arrive at a consensus, no matter what the "Official" name of something is.

I have also found this truth in Children's Ministries. Sunday School or faith Formation? Chapel or Children's Church? As far as I'm concerned, call it what you want, just show up for it! But for the purists with a burning desire to know the absolute, correct term, it's like this: when I was growing up we called it Sunday School which didn't sound all that appealing because of that whole "school" thing. Recently it's been known as faith formation which also gives some insight into what's going on at 9:00 and 10:00am on Sundays. Chapel and faith formation are two separate opportunities for your kids to experience the love of God. Ff is before the service. During those 50 minutes we create, play and experience different ways to learn about Jesus. Chapel is during the service. It mirrors what is going on in the Nave and Great Hall but in a kid-friendly way. We read the Psalm and Gospel lessons, recite the Children's Creed and say the Prayers of the People and Lord's Prayer. And we sing. A lot!

In addition to these opportunities for your kids to deepen their relationship with Jesus we have a class specifically designed for 4yrs – 1st graders. Godly Play is a Montessori based, hands-on, multi-sensorial experience of Biblical stories. It has been offered downtown for many years and I'm excited to announce that it will now be offered at CCS beginning this fall! But to ensure that we are able to continue to offer all of these opportunities, we need more teachers! If you resemble that remark, give me a call and let's get you into the mix!

And no matter what you call it, I hope to see you there!




I am looking forward to another wonderful year with our youth. I feel grateful every time we have fun experiences together and get to know each other better. Thank you for trusting me with your kids.




