FROM THE RECTOR:

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith... Hebrews 12.1-2

At the Sydney Olympics, the world was introduced to Eric "The Swimmer" Moussambani of Equatorial Guinea. The 22-year-old African had only learned to swim the previous January. Eric had only practiced in a 20-meter pool without lane markers, and he had never raced more than 50 meters. By special invitation of the International Olympic Committee, under a special program, Eric had been entered in the 100-meter men's freestyle.

When the other two swimmers in his heat were disqualified because of false starts, Moussambani was forced to swim alone. Eric Moussambani was, to use the words of an Associated Press story about his race, "charmingly inept." He never put his head under the water's surface and flailed wildly to stay afloat. With ten meters left to the wall, he virtually came to a stop. Some spectators thought he might drown!

Even though his time was over a minute slower than what qualified for the next level of competition, the capacity crowd at the Olympic Aquatic Center stood to their feet and cheered Eric on. After what seemed like an eternity, the African reached the wall and hung on for dear life. When he had caught his breath and regained his composure, the French-speaking Moussambani said through an

interpreter, "I want to send hugs and kisses to the crowd. It was their cheering that kept me going."


We too have a cheering section. We cannot see them all, but the book of Hebrews reminds us that a 'great cloud of witnesses', composed of all the faithful departed, is pulling for us as we make our way through this life.

In a few days, we will observe All Saints. And a month from now, we will celebrate Thanksgiving. This year, I invite you to give particular thanks to God for your cheering section. I especially remember my grandparents and parents, an amazing group of elementary and middle-school teachers in Corpus Christi, and a group of Episcopal women in south Texas. For much of my life, they and others have been cheering me forward as a student, a Christian, a man, and a minister. I thank God for them. I thank God for their prayers, their witness, and their encouragement.

For whom do you cheer? Persevere in your support for them. It might be the difference between disappointment and victory.

from the associate rector... The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector

I grew up in a Christian household, in a thriving church community, where I learned Jesus loved me from a very early age. I gave my life to serving him when I was still a kid. I am so grateful for the Christian witness that I grew up around and am thankful for the ways I was introduced to Jesus by my family, folks at my church, and my pastors.

But one facet of the Christian faith was not really present for me at all in these early years, that was the Saints. I didn't know about "the great cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1) who went before me, to whom I could look and find examples of what it meant to follow Jesus.

And I am not just saying that I missed out on the lives of post-biblical Saints like St. Augustine of Hippo, or St. Thomas Aquinas, or St. Julian of Norwich; we didn't even pay much attention to biblical Saints St. Luke or St. Michael or St. Priscilla.

I am not casting shade on anyone, by the way. Just observing that, although I received many gifts of faith while growing up, an appreciation for the Saints was not one of them. It wasn't that the kind of Christianity I was shown didn't make sense, it was just kind of skeletal and bare-bones in this respect.

Part of what drew me to the more catholic vision of Christianity we find in the Anglican Communion, and in The Episcopal Church more particularly, was this filling out of the deposit of faith. I was drawn to this more heavily populated Christianity and the witness of those living and dead. I was longing for steady, faithful examples of holy women and men who'd modelled what it meant to walk in the way of Jesus in their own time and place.

None of the Saints are perfect. They are sinners like you and me. But they are holy, because the Holy Spirit has

sanctified them and they've cooperated with this grace such that their lives shine with it. I now love to learn about the Saints and hear their stories.

What's more, any version with Christianity that does not present us with an account of the Saints leaves a vacuum, and this vacuum will not stand to be empty. In North American Christianity, where we don't have Saints, we have celebrity Christians.

Sometimes these celebrity Christians are pastors, usually young, usually very fit, charismatic, attractive. Or perhaps they are musicians, members of bands with sleek names and slick recordings. Or maybe they are academics, the smart type who have written books and seem to know all that there is to know about God.

A lot of times these are great people. Sometimes they are shysters and frauds. But they are admired by us not because they are holy, with lives utterly devoted to Jesus, but because they are talented or beautiful or intelligent.

The Saints might be all of these things too. They might be none of these things. But they are people who are holy. As we approach the feast of All Saints, may God give us the grace to honor them, and follow their examples.



November 17, 11:05am at South Campus. Bishop Fisher will be here for confirmation.


