Rev. Gary Wilburn notes that in 1636, amid the darkness of the Thirty Years' War, a German pastor, Martin Rinkart, is said to have buried five thousand of his parishioners in one year – an average of fifteen funerals a day. His parish was ravaged by war, death, and economic disaster.

In the heart of that deep darkness, with the cries of fear outside his window, Rev. Rinkart sat down and wrote this prayer for his children:

Now thank we all our God With heart and hands and voices; Who wondrous things had done, In whom His world rejoices. Who, from our mother's arms, Hath led us on our way With countless gifts of love And still is ours today (The Hymnal 1982 #397)

(110 11 ymmar 1702 11951)

What a powerful model of a grateful heart.

Every person in every place in every time faced adversity. As we approach Thanksgiving, I pray that, whatever difficulties you face or disappointment you have endured, you will see the many blessings our Lord has showered upon your life. And you will be reminded of God's great love for you.

## from the associate rector... The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector

When (if!) you are reading this, you will be starting to think about Thanksgiving. You might already be thinking about Christmas. And though we celebrate these holidays for different reasons, and they are laden with their own sets of traditions, they share this one thing in common: They are celebrated with feasting.

Feasting is a difficult concept for North Americans. It is a difficult concept because we tend to vacillate between two extremes that exclude the possibility of true feasting.

On the one hand, we tend gorge ourselves on the typical American diet, which is chockful of more fat and salt and sugar than any of us needs. Everyday, every meal becomes a kind of feast, but a cheapened feast, a sham-feast, a feast without soul. We eat more than our fill of fast food and candy and soda (which, by the way, in Canada, we call "pop") and then worry about our waistlines.

On the other hand, which is not unrelated to the above, we get sick of the American lifestyle and start to diet, obsessively worrying about which foods we should or should not consume, trying to survive on whatever new cocktail of chemically enhanced trend-food promises to keep the calories off.

Writer and priest Robert Farrar Capon first alerted me to this problem. Thinking of the way Americans worry about calories, in *The Supper of the Lamb*, he writes,

A calorie is not a thing; it is a measurement. In itself, it does not exist. It is simply a way of specifying a particular property of things, namely, how much heat they give off when burned. Only things, you see, are capable of being eaten or burned, loved or loathed; no one ever yet got his teeth into a calorie.

He goes on to say ,"How sad, then, to see real beings...

calorie counters — living their lives in abject terror of things that do not even go bump in the night." In other words, we shouldn't be afraid of calories, Capon is saying, because calories don't exist in any substantial sense!

I am convinced by most what Capon has to say, though I do find myself worrying from time to time as the plentiful and delicious beer and barbecue of Texas calls my name. What I am certain of, however, is that even if some concern about calories is justified, it must be put out of mind for the holidays.

Thanksgiving, along with Christmas (which is coming quickly!) are occasions for feasting, for gathering with friends and family to eat roast meat, to revel in lovely starchy potatoes, and to enjoy luscious pumpkin pie topped with fatty ice cream.

We feast to give thanks and to celebrate the life that God has given us. Life is not always easy. Families are sometimes complicated. Some years are lean years.

Still, it is good to feast, to take a day to cease the hustle, the grind, and to simply be. Be what? Be thankful to God.

Feasting allows us to see that life is good, that God is good, and to glimpse a little of an even greater feast, when "the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear" (Isaiah 25:6). This will be the best feast, and we won't be thinking about calories at all!


- 1. Don't be late. When one has an important meeting to go to they normally arrive a few minutes early.

- 6. During the passing of the peace stay in your area as opposed to walking to the other side to greet people.
- 7. Silence cell phones.




