FROM THE RECTOR:

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." Luke 1.26-29

Mary's house in Nazareth is quite small, smaller than most living rooms.

Dirt floor. Mud walls. Extremely humble.

We do not know how many siblings Mary had, but there was not much personal space in their home. Privacy was negligible to non-existent for her.

Mary was likely very young. Teenager-young. Perhaps early-teenager young.

Which makes her selection by the Creator of the Universe all the more remarkable.

God could have chosen a princess, but He chose Mary. The Lord could have chosen an wise adult, a National Merit finalist, Miss Universe, but He chose Mary of Nazareth.

God chose to enter into the world through a young teenage girl living in a modest home in a very small town in a minor part of the Roman Empire.

Mary's response to Gabriel is, perhaps, the greatest statement of faith in the Bible.

"My soul magnifies the Lord. My spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for He who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is His name." Luke 1.46-49

As we celebrate Thanksgiving and begin the walk through Advent, rejoice that God has chosen you. He has chosen to love you. He has chosen to bless you. He has chosen to save you.

The Lord has called you to a great task—to follow Christ. I pray that this Advent, the Lord will do great things in your life. Preparing you—as never before—to celebrate the birth and life of Jesus Christ.

from the associate rector... The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector

Isn't it interesting how time works? Every hour has sixty minutes, and every minute has sixty seconds, but the texture, the feel of those hours and minutes varies greatly.

A minute flies by when I am driving on the highway listening to music.

A minute waiting for the kettle to boil for my first cup of coffee in the morning seems to take forever.

An hour passes like a breeze when I am working on sermon, thinking deeply, trying to write.

An hour moves as slow as molasses when I'm trying to make it from supper to my kiddos' bedtime after a night of poor sleep.

I am sure you can think of our own experiences of time moving quickly or slow. A rule of thumb has emerged for me: Generally speaking, if I am waiting for something, time moves a little slower. If I am not anticipating something to happen, time glides by a little quicker.

As we turn the page to the season of Advent in the next days, we are reminded of the waiting we do as Christians.

Advent itself is a waiting time, a time of preparation and anticipation as we get ready for Christmas, or *Christ Mass* (the Mass of Christ's birth). We deck the halls and play the carols, buy gifts and wrap them, bake cookies and take them to Christmas parties. But we also pray, reflect, remember, turning our hearts to Jesus's coming in worship.

And Advent itself is only a microcosm of another kind of wait-

ing. In Advent we prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas by remembering Christ's coming two thousand years ago. But in Advent we also wait for Christ's *coming again*. As we sing each verse of *O Come, O Come, Emmauel*, we long for a world we cannot yet see, but one which we know Christ is bringing to us:

O come, O King of nations, bind

in one the hearts of all mankind.

Bid all our sad divisions cease


and be yourself our King of Peace

We do not live in a world where all divisions have ceased, where Jesus's royal peace is widespread. So we wait. Sometimes the injustice of the world makes time crawl by. And sometimes life so rich and full that we forget we are waiting. And still we wait.

Here is another thing: I've noticed the kettle boils a little quicker in the morning when I am not standing there watching it. If I put away the dishes in the dishwasher, or if I help my sons make breakfast, that kettle seems to pick up speed. Waiting is a little easier when we have work to do.

In this season of Advent, and the wider life of longing and hope we live as Christians, we can work while we wait. We have prayers to pray, spiritual lives to deepen, neighbours to serve, good work to do.

What work has God given you to do while you wait?






